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AS PART of the annual India-China Youth Exchange programme, a 200-member Indian Youth Delegation visited China with an aim of strengthening people-to-people exchanges between the two countries. The delegation comprising of students, researchers, youth leaders and young achievers visited various Chinese cities including Beijing, Wuhan, Kunming, Shanghai and Guangzhou.

Six students from IIM Raipur, Bansari Bhanushali, Chaitanya Dwivedi, Dhanashree Nemade, Manali Chakrabarty, Navya Umashankar and Vinay Jain participated in this programme and interacted with the volunteers of All China Youth Federation as well as top-level management personnel of leading businesses.
